I have nine siblings but only five of us and my mom were able to seek Asylum in America in 2005 during the Liberian civil war. My dad and the four oldest decided to stay behind to grant us a better life. In Buffalo, my twin brother and I met a member of the church in our band class. He asked us to come to his scout troop meeting. Then he asked if we wanted to come to the church, which we said yes, and then he asked us to meet the missionaries and we agreed. After meeting with the missionaries we decided we wanted to get baptized on one condition: we don't go on a mission. We were already the oldest kids in our grade and wanted to go to college at a regular age. A few years later my twin brother and I decided to break the only condition we set, and started filling out our mission papers. We were also the first to become citizens of the USA. And the rest is history.

Elder Hoffman is an accomplished pianist and singer. He has performed in various plays and performances. He's been raised the last eight years by his dad who currently drives an Uber car. His mother died of cancer. They really didn't have the money for her to receive treatment. Even with this hardship, the dad and son have remained faithful.
